dig back into the gardens. It is important that children know where food comes from and how simple it is to grow themselves.



We love harvesting and taking home some of the produce so if you find some garden treasures in their school bag or lunch box please talk about it with your children. They may want to share how we've used it at gardening club to create a tasty snack. A favourite was last week's 'Silverbeet and Feta Toastie' (that's what we're calling them anyway). Silverbeet is easy to grow and you can add it to almost anything! And who would have thought the children would enjoy it so much!

And our very own 'Silverbeet and Feta Toasties!'



Silverbeet and Feta Toastie

8 approx leaves of silverbeet (stems removed) cut finely, it might look like lots but it wilts down 1 1/2 cups grated tasty cheese or more!

Crumbled feta

10 wraps, could also use pita pockets

Olive oil, salt and pepper

Turn on your sandwich press to heat up, could also use a fry pan on medium but might get a little tricky flipping these.

Add finely cut silverbeet to a bowl, mix in the tasty cheese.

Lightly oil one side of the first wrap, place oil side down in the sandwich press, place a big hand full of silverbeet/ cheese mix onto the wrap, you can put lots in as the silverbeet will wilt down, sprinkle some crumbled feta, salt and pepper. Place another wrap on top and lightly oil the top and close the press. Leave for around 3 minutes (you'll know when it's done - it'll be nice and toasted). Let it cool a little, slice like a pizza and enjoy! You can absolutely add other ingredients too or more/less cheese, it's so easy the children can do it!

TRAFFIC PARKING

I would like to ask parents to not park on the grass verge on Hyde Road and also observe the NO PARKING restrictions in this area.

NEW ZEALAND SHAKE OUT

New Zealand ShakeOut, our national earthquake drill is taking place on Thursday 18 October 2018 at 9:30 am. The school will be taking part in the New Zealand Shake Out. At that time we will ask everyone to Drop, Cover and Hold for up to one minute. Some areas will practise a tsunami hīkoi yet we will not do that this time.

The children will:

Do the Drop, Cover, and Hold drill for 30-60 seconds:

- DROP down on your hands and knees. This protects you from falling but lets you move if you need to.
- COVER your head and neck (or your entire body if possible) under a sturdy table or desk (if it is within a few steps of you).
- HOLD on to your shelter (or your position to protect your head and neck) until the shaking stops. If the shaking shifts your shelter around, move with it.

Other ideas are:

If you are unable to drop, brace yourself in a chair or wheelchair (lock your wheels) and cover your head and neck with your hands and arms. If you are unable to get out of bed, cover your head and neck with a pillow.

Many people are injured while trying to move DURING the shaking. It is safer to Drop, Cover, and Hold until the shaking is over.
