#### **POLICY REVIEW**

#### ATTENDANCE

Student attendance has been quite a topic in the media lately. Every term the school receives a report from the Ministry of Education about our school attendance and I thought our school community may be interested in some of our attendance facts.

The Term 2 Attendance Report sent by the Ministry of Education notes:

- Average attendance was at 89.6% (2021 Term 2 it was 94.8%).
- Nearly 60% of our students attended 90 100% in Term 2.
- Most common reason for not attending was medical yet I have noticed that students being absent to go on trips overseas is increasing.
- Term 1 Browns Bay School attendance was above all measurements for Decile 10, Auckland, Contributing school and All schools.

*'Regular'* attendance is defined for statistical purposes as 90% or higher. However, Ministry of Education analysis shows every day has a cumulative impact on a child's learning and there is no 'safe' level of non-attendance. **Every day matters.**

# **OUT OF ZONE ENROLMENT 2023 APPLICATIONS**

Browns Bay School invites enrolment applications from parents who wish to enrol their children for next year. Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office or online <u>here</u>.

The deadline for receipt of applications for out-of-zone places is Wednesday 28 September.

Parents of students who live within the home zone should also apply by this date to assist the school to plan appropriately for next year.

The Board has determined that 15 Year 0-1 places are likely to be available for out-of-zone students next year. The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone.

#### TE WIKI O TE REO MAORI

Next week is Te Wiki o Te Reo Maori / Maori Language Week. As part of the celebrations the Browns Bay School Kapa Haka group will be performing at the:

Pīpīwharauroa Festival of Mātauranga



E ngā mana, e ngā reo, e ngā karangatanga maha o te motu, tēnā rā koutou katoa.

On 13 September, Rangitoto College is hosting the inaugural Pīpīwharauroa Festival, a Festival of Mātauranga. This festival is the culmination of an innovative programme within the Mid Bays Kāhui Ako (COL) to authentically weave Mātauranga Māori across our curriculum in Term 3.

Using the uniting thread of the Pīpīwharauroa (bronze shining cuckoo), this event provides an authentic platform for learners from Year 0 - Year 10+ to engage in Mātauranga Māori in a festival that weaves kapa haka, te reo, species ecology, art, commerce, community, whanaungatanga and maramataka, all in time for Te Wiki o Te Reo Māori, Māori Language Week, and Māhuru Māori - Māori Language September.

The festival is supported through the Natural Science team at The Museum of Auckland and supported by the School of Biological Science, Unitec.

Part of our Kaupapa for this Festival of Mātauranga is to share the knowledge and resources with the wider community, and ultimately develop opportunities for educators and students to embed mātauranga into their curriculum. As such, each year we would like to gift the primary school and secondary school resources, for the festival to COLs from different compass points.

We would like to invite you all to attend and celebrate the festivities on the day.

# KINDO INFORMATION – FOR PARENTS/CAREGIVERS

Kindo, myKindo and ezlunch were recently classified as a Financial Service Provider. This means that there are additional responsibilities

they must undertake, including compliance with the strict regulations imposed under the Anti-Money Laundering and Countering Financing of Terrorism Act (AML).

They are now implementing the required changes. Account holders will be diverted to a page on myKindo to accept the new terms and can read further information about it on that page. Further changes in line with those new terms are being implemented, starting today and over the next few weeks.

#### Withdrawal options of credit balances

As a reminder: Withdrawal options of credit balances are limited to amounts refunded by schools or registered charities.
