KEEPING OURSELVES SAFE

In the last weeks of this term all classes will be focusing on the KEEPING OURSELVES SAFE topic. The children will learn:

- to work out when their safety is at risk, for example walking home alone in the dark
- how to keep safe when they meet and mix with other people
- who and how to ask for help if they, or someone they know, is being abused
- to go on asking for help until someone does something to stop the abuse

• that it is important to make and follow personal, family and school safety rules They will know:

- that abuse is never okay
- that abuse is never their fault

This topic involves the NZ Police Education Officer (PEO) taking specific lessons with some classes when required. To be successful, Keeping Ourselves Safe needs your help and support. Some homework activities will come home for you to work on with your child. It is important that you participate as much as possible, so that you can reinforce the messages children are getting and help your child use their new skills with confidence. Some of the activities are very specific (i.e. naming body parts) and I would encourage parents to check out the website:

2020 CLASS PLANNING

I am currently working on class numbers for 2020 (NOT placements yet) and ask parents to notify me if they know they are going to change schools in 2020. Also, if you know of any family with pre-school children that have not enrolled for 2020 – ask them to **enrol online** by Friday 20 September so we can finalise planning for 2020.

This week we have altered our enrolment processes and will be directing any new enrolments to our website. On the Website page ENROLMENTS are links to information on our school, the policy and zoning restrictions, information for "nearly 5s" and the portal for enrolling students.

Once a parent has completed the form online, they will receive an email within 10 working days confirming we have received the application. This will also include information about the school and the next steps.



If your enrolment is for a nearly 5 year old our Assistant Principal, Jacky Carr, will be in touch prior to your child starting to arrange pre-school visits and to make a time to meet. If it is for an older student you may be contacted by Jacky or by our Deputy Principal, Jo Hewitt (depending on your child's age).

If parents need to speak to anyone regarding the enrolment, bring in any documentation required for enrolment purposes or to try on uniforms, we will be asking that you call or email to make an appointment.

PROPERTY DEVELOPMENT

The drilling machine in the lower carpark this week is part of a Geotech Survey of the school to give guidance to the Ministry of Education (Property Dept.) for future building developments. The Board have been working closely with the MOE over the past years regarding the growth of our school and the building needs. This drilling is just part of that process.
