


## **MEMORIAL DAY HOLIDAY**

## **LIFE EDUCATION**

A visit from the Life Education Mobile Classroom has been arranged for our Year 0-5 students from 17 October until 09 November. The Life Education programme encourages children to adopt a healthy lifestyle with an emphasis on the things children can do to look after themselves. It aims to help children develop respect, understanding and appreciation of the human body. A Life Education Trust educator will work with us to teach some of those important health ideas. The sophisticated technology and equipment of the Life Education programme supplements and extends the resources that we are able to offer the children.



Year 6 children will not be involved in this programme this year, due to the 'Choice' programme.

We would also like to invite parents to attend a special session of the Life Education Mobile Classroom to experience for yourselves the nature of activities your child/children will be involved in. ## **PIPIWHARAURUA FESTIVAL**


On 13 September, Rangitoto College hosted the inaugural Pīpīwharaua Festival, a Festival of Mātauranga. This festival is the culmination of an innovative programme within the Mid Bays Kāhui Ako (COL) to authentically weave Mātauranga Māori across our curriculum in Term 3.

Using the uniting thread of the Pīpīwharaua (bronze shining cuckoo), this event provided an authentic platform for learners from Year 0 - Year 10+ to engage in Mātauranga Māori in a festival that weaved kapa haka, te reo, species ecology, art, commerce, community, whanaungatanga and maramataka, all in time for Te Wiki o Te Reo Māori, Māori Language Week, and Māhuru Māori - Māori Language September.

The festival was supported through the Natural Science team at the Museum of Auckland and supported by the School of Biological Science, Unitec.


Part of our Kaupapa for this Festival of Mātauranga is to share the knowledge and resources with the wider community, and ultimately develop opportunities for educators and students to embed mātauranga into their curriculum.

The Browns Bay School Kapa Haka group performed wonderfully at the festival and students across the school also showed wonderful art pieces based on the Pīpiwharauoa /Bronze Shining Cuckoo. Special thanks to Meika Isgrove, Karen Warren and Kylie Engleback for supporting the children in preparation for the Festival. Our students made us very proud on the day!

Last week the Year 4's boarded the bus and travelled to Kelly Tarlton's to support their learning around Antarctica. ### **OUT OF ZONE ENROLMENT APPLICATIONS 2023**

Browns Bay School invites out of zone enrolment applications from parents who wish to enrol their children for next year.

Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office or online [here](#). Applications can be made through the Browns Bay School website [here](#).

The deadline for receipt of applications for out-of-zone places is Wednesday 28 September.

Parents of students who live within the home zone should also apply by this date to assist the school to plan appropriately for next year.


## **NEW ZEALAND SHAKE OUT**

New Zealand Shake Out, our national earthquake drill, is taking place on Thursday 27 October 2022 at 9:30am. The school will be taking part in the New Zealand Shake Out. At that time, we will ask everyone to Drop, Cover and Hold for up to one minute. Some areas will practise a tsunami hīkoi, yet we will not do that this time.

The children will:

Do the Drop, Cover, and Hold drill for 30-60 seconds:

- DROP down on your hands and knees. This protects you from falling but lets you move if you need to.
- COVER your head and neck (or your entire body if possible) under a sturdy table or desk (if it is within a few steps of you).
- HOLD on to your shelter (or your position to protect your head and neck) until the shaking stops. If the shaking shifts your shelter around, move with it.



Other ideas are:

If you are unable to drop, brace yourself in a chair or wheelchair (lock your wheels) and cover your head and neck with your hands and arms. If you are unable to get out of bed, cover your head and neck with a pillow.

Many people are injured while trying to move DURING the shaking. It is safer to Drop, Cover, and Hold until the shaking is over.





