SCHOOL CHARTER

At the last meeting the Board accepted the 2018 Charter and Annual Plan. This document is on the school website at <u>https://www.brownsbay.school.nz/teaching-learning/charter</u> This is our guiding document that maps out a direction for the next three years and supports our vision of Building Leaders and Learners.

This year we have added two new Strategic Principles to the Charter:

- To develop innovative learning environments and opportunities to unlock the potential of our students, and develop in them the capacity for life-long learning.
- To acknowledge that education of a child involves three key relationships the child, the teachers and the family/whanau. All three must collaborate together to ensure learning occurs.

A main area of teacher professional development this year is in Mathematics with consultant Marie Hirst (Special Addition), and funded by the Ministry of Education. The teachers will be looking at adopting an Accelerated Learning in Mathematics (ALim) approach with their students. Another key area of development is investigating Innovative Teaching Practices with Jo Robson: Learning in the 21st Century - *Who do we need to consider it? How can we adapt? What can we investigate?*

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Community Notices

A sub-committee of the Board is having regular meetings with the MOE Property Infrastructure team on planning for our Roll Growth and classroom replacements for the leased rooms on the field. This group is in the early stage of a long process that will give a 'blue print' for Browns Bay School for the next 20 years.

NATIONAL STANDARDS

The Board of Trustees received the 2017 National Standards Report at its recent meeting. The National Standards

Report was a requirement by the Ministry of Education for all schools over the previous year's, yet is now no longer a requirement to report on.

The table below shows the percentage of students AT and ABOVE the standards and shows the continuing high levels of success the children are having at Browns Bay School.


