

PRINCIPALS MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Caregivers, Kia Ora

The weather event on Tuesday was a challenge for a lot of people in our community and I hope everyone is safe and getting dry. At school, the buildings and grounds generally managed the heavy rain, apart from a blocked drain and some new leaks. The children were calm during the rain and coped with the situation.

If you did not receive any of the communications on Tuesday, can you please check in with the school office to ensure we have your current emails and mobile numbers.

EMERGENCY LOCKDOWN PRACTICE (WEDNESDAY 17 MAY)

As part of keeping our school safe we need to be able to respond safely and quickly to a range of emergency situations. We work alongside an independent company, Harrison Tew*, who specialise in emergency management planning for schools, and whose procedures have been successfully implemented in hundreds of schools throughout New Zealand.

As part of maintaining our emergency procedures in our school, specialised training is being conducted with our Senior Leadership Team and staff by Harrison Tew*. The students will also receive information on how to respond in an emergency directed at their respective age groups from either their teacher or Harrison Tew*.

We will then be conducting a lockdown exercise under the guidance and support of Harrison Tew[®].

During the exercise you will receive a notification from the school, so it is important that your emergency contact details are up to date and correct. The notification will emphasise that this is an exercise/practice and will explain that all updated information will then be posted on the school website.

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In a genuine incident, should you become aware of a lockdown or evacuation at the school, can I please ask that you do not attend the school or phone, as we will not be able to respond. Your presence or contact may make it more difficult for us or the emergency services to manage a situation.

YEAR GROUP TOPICS

This Term classes will be focusing on a variety of topics covering Science, Social Sciences, Technology and Health. The Year groups will be investigating:

Year 1 Science / Technology: Past and Present

Year 2 Science: BBS Alive
Year 3 Science: Bees are VIP's
Year 4 Science: Rocky Shore
Year 5 Social Sciences: NZ History
Year 6 Science / Technology: Disasters

As well as these Year group topics the whole school will be involved in Keeping Ourselves Safe (Health Programme), Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L) and the Literacy programmes of Structured Literacy and The Code. We have put some information on our school website about <u>Structured Literacy</u> for our Year 1 and 2 parents.

ATTENDANCE

The Government has recently funded the Attendance and Engagement Strategy. The strategy focuses on students being present, participating and progressing. It is important that students are present at school. A high absence rate can affect students learning over the years. I fully understand if your child is sick and needs to be at home to recuperate yet, please check all absences to ensure they are necessary.

The Ministry of Education defines regular attendance as being at school 90% or higher. Last term 83.5% of our students achieved that level. Regular Attendance means only

'Regular' attendance is defined for statistical purposes as 90% or higher. However, Ministry of Education analysis shows every day has a cumulative impact on a child's learning and there is no 'safe' level of non-attendance.

Every day matters.

having an absence of less than 5 days per term, or 20 days per year. (A justified absence is when the student is too sick to attend school or has suffered a bereavement). Holidays should only be taken in school holidays.

POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING (PB4L)

Our focus in our PB4L lessons for the next few weeks is school uniform. It's wonderful to see lots of correct uniform being worn with pride by students. We want all students to understand why it's important to wear the correct uniform and what the expectations are. We'll start with the items you can wear under and over your uniform. Here's a reminder of the uniform expectations:

Road Safety Week 15-21 May 2023

This year, Road Safety Week is about celebrating our Road Safety
Heroes, recognising all those who work to make our roads safer. It's an opportunity
for us to celebrate your own Road Safety Heroes, such as school crossing patrol,
parents and teachers who help teach children road safety.

Please spend time talking to your children about the following information while using sustainable transport to get to school.

- Be Bright, Be Seen! When you're walking or riding around the roads wear something bright. This could be a high Vis arm band or vest... or put something bright on your school bag.
- Always Cross on a Crossing It's safer to always use a crossing... but no matter what you should always STOP, LOOK and LISTEN before you cross the road. NEVER run across the road!
- Buckle up. "It's safer to wait till your 148cm" before you can sit in a
 regular car seat you must be 148cm. If you're not 148cm then you should
 be sitting in a booster seat.
- 4. Watch out for sneaky driveways. They are sneaky because drivers can't see you and you can't see them!!! Listen well and keep looking as you go past driveways that have bad visibility.
- 5. Don't play with toys or balls while walking alongside a road. If they go out on the road you could cause an accident for people trying to avoid them and you can't go after them! Stay focused, concentrate and hold onto your things or better still, keep them in a bag until you reach a safe area to play.

The North Shore Swimming Championships is a very competitive event involving many schools on the North Shore. Most events have up to 30 competitors competing.


Well done to the Browns Bay School team. We are proud of the way you supported one another and displayed all the Browns Bay School Values throughout the day!
