Self-control: cultivating the abilities to focus and delay self-gratification (responsibility, restraint).


Integrity: recognising right from wrong and practicing ethical behaviour (courage, honesty)

SCHOOL EVENTS

KEEPING OURSELVES SAFE

In the last weeks of this term all classes will be focusing on the KEEPING OURSELVES SAFE topic. The children will learn:

- to work out when their safety is at risk, for example walking home alone in the dark
- how to keep safe when they meet and mix with other people
- who and how to ask for help if they, or someone they know, is being abused
- to go on asking for help until someone does something to stop the abuse
- that it is important to make and follow personal, family and school safety rules

They will know:

- that abuse is never okay
- that abuse is never their fault

This topic involves the NZ Police Education Officer (PEO) taking specific lessons with some classes when required. To be successful, Keeping Ourselves Safe needs your help and support. Some homework activities will come home for you to work on with your child. It is important that you participate as much as possible, so that you can reinforce the messages children are getting and help your child use their new skills with confidence. Some of the activities are very specific (i.e. naming body parts) and I would encourage parents to check out the website:

Set out to learn a word a day for a year – see 365 Māori words



It will be solar powered and based in the ESOL garden beside the ramp near Room 7. We're not taking orders yet, but the prototype is looking great!


