Dear Parents and Caregivers Kia Ora

Thank you to all the parents and caregivers who were able to attend the Conferences. If you wish to have a conversation about your child, please contact the teacher to arrange a time that suits everyone.

While the Conferences were taking place, I took the opportunity to talk to the Year 4 to 6 students about the new building. I shared the design and current photos of the interior layout with the students. They were very interested in the process and keen to see the final build. I gave the students a tentative date of Term 3 for the transition into the new building.

We are currently working with the Year 5 and 6 teachers on a series of Frequently Asked Questions to share with the Community on the new build.

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To locate our school site on SchoolDocs enter the website address into your browser. The SchoolDocs page will open,


click the green button "Search for your school" (highlighted), enter our school's name into the search area and the Sign In box will appear. The Username is **brownsbay** and the password is **bbs**.

COVID-19

The school has maintained an orange setting since the start of Term 2. In the table below I am providing some information on our current levels of Covid-19

We currently have 22 students who are self-isolating at home.

Most of the cases are spread across the school with most classes having 1 or 2 Covid cases reported. We did notice a spike in one room. The parents were informed of the situation and children in that room were asked to wear masks. The room is being well ventilated and has had an air purifier installed.

The school has received two air purifiers from the Ministry of Education and 4 CO2 monitors. The purifiers have been placed in a high traffic area and in a room with challenging ventilation. The monitors are being moved around the school to check the air quality in different rooms.


Teacher Aide Position
