

PRINCIPALS MESSAGE

Dear Parents/Caregivers Kia Ora Koutou

I would like to welcome the families of new students who have enrolled at Browns Bay School. This week we have enrolled 18 students into various year levels across the school.

TERM 4

Term 4 finishes on Friday 16 December at 1.00pm and between now and then we have a busy educational programme for your children.

The Term 4 curriculum focus is: **Community / Hapori** and the Key Understanding is **'A group of people coming together and sharing common resources, social responsibilities, interests and values.'** The various Year teams will be looking at this topic in different ways — these will be shared with you through Team newsletters. Other major events happening across the school this term are Athletics, Waterwise, Jingle and various trips organised by the Teams. We also have the Life Education Caravan and Harold at school in the carpark (Room 9 are shown above with Charlie and Harold in the background). There will be an optional parent session held in the van on 02 Nov 2.15pm.

Term 4 is a very important term for a school as it is a time where we review student's progress and achievement in preparation for reporting to parents. It is important that children attend school regularly, so teachers have the time to get a valid and accurate assessment of where your child is at.

Reminder: Labour Day holiday is Monday 24 October and school will not be open.

COMMUNITY SURVEY

The Browns Bay School Board are collecting feedback from parents to assist in their development of the Browns Bay School Strategic Plan 2023 to 2025. The feedback is focused around five questions:

- 1. What are your aspirations for your child at our school?
- 2. What worries you about your child at school? Possible solutions?
- 3. What would you like your children to learn about or do more of at school?
- 4. How could the school better connect with you as a parent?
- 5. Any other suggestions or ideas?

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Also included in this survey will be a section where we consult with our community on aspects of the Health curriculum. Your responses will help us to make decisions about how much emphasis is placed on different aspects of Health.

A link to the Survey Monkey form will be emailed to all families. As in all schools, people will have differing ideas and ultimately it is the Board's responsibility to take this into account when they make decisions. The better the information they have, the more confident they can feel about making the best decision. The analysed information will be summarised in a written report to the Board and Community. If you cannot do the form electronically then paper copies will be available in the school office.

This survey will be sent out next week and closes on 11 November.

OPEN MORNING

On **WEDNESDAY 26 OCTOBER** parents and caregivers are invited to visit the classrooms from 9am to 10.30am. The classroom programme will be a normal Wednesday morning and you are welcome to go into the rooms and see the classes in action.

This is an optional event for parents and we intend to make it a regular feature in the future.

PROPERTY NEWS

The eight relocatable classrooms on the field are either ready to be transported off or being deconstructed in readiness to go. The ground was too soft in the term break for the trucks and the removal companies do not want to rip up our fields more than necessary – the rooms will slowly disappear over the next few weeks. The field will be blocked off when these moves happen.

The large poles in the Junior Playground are for the Room 1 to 7 canopy – they were all ready to go up, yet the installers found the connections were not correctly made. These are expected to go up later this week.

NEW ZEALAND SHAKE OUT

New Zealand Shake Out, our national earthquake drill will take place nationally next Thursday, yet we will practice ours a week later. We are delaying our practice due to school wide activities we are doing that day. We do not take part in the tsunami hikoi as the school is above the inundation zone for a tsunami.



The children will be asked to: Do the Drop, Cover, and Hold

- DROP down on your hands and knees. This protects you from falling but lets you move if you need to.
- COVER your head and neck (or your entire body if possible) under a sturdy table or desk (if it is within a few steps of you).
- HOLD on to your shelter (or your position to protect your head and neck) until the shaking stops. If the shaking shifts your shelter around, move with it.

OUTDOOR EDUCATION PROGRAMME 2023 – POLICE VETS


- As most of you will be aware the school runs a very extensive Outdoor Education Programme, incorporating a sequential skill development programme, from Years 1-6. We are planning a full return of our programme for 2023, including an overnight stay for our Year 4 students as part of their Outdoor Education experience.
- As an added safety precaution, the Board of Trustees has a policy in place requiring all parents who stay overnight at any of our Year 4, 5 or 6 camps to undergo a Police Vet.
- It is vital that we have parent support at our camps, both during the day and overnight. Without this support these programmes will not be able to take place.
- If there is any possibility that you might be considering staying overnight at any Year 4, 5 or 6 camp in 2023 could you please contact the school office, and we will send the relevant documentation to you. These vets must be submitted as soon as possible as the process can take several weeks.
- (If you have previously been vetted by the school, you will be notified if your vet is no longer valid).
