# He aroha whakatō, he aroha puta mai. If kindness is sown, then kindness you shall receive.

This year we are thrilled to be launching Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L)

Explore new ideas
 Wonder and question
 Experiment, reflect and create
 Show critical, creative and innovative thinking

at Browns Bay School. PB4L is a school wide initiative that aims to develop a positive school culture using evidence-based behaviour management strategies. In other words, we want to embed positive behaviour practices that support the whole school community and enable students to feel confident, connected and actively involved in school life. We will be running short lessons, once a week, across the school that focus on school wide behaviour needs which have been identified by staff and students. PB4L has been proven to be most successful when lessons are short and clear and when students receive positive feedback when they are spotted doing the desired behaviour.

Our first lessons focus on Health and Wellbeing. We will begin with Hat Wearing. In order to be sun safe students are required to wear a hat when outside (even if it's overcast). If a student doesn't have a hat with them, they will need to stay in the shaded areas during breaks, fitness and physical education lessons. Could you please support your child by checking that they have a named school hat in their bag each morning? This will enable them to participate fully in all areas of the curriculum and during the school day.



We look forward to seeing how PB4L enhances our already established school values and helps our community to thrive.

#### STRUCTURED LITERACY

Browns Bay School has made the decision to change their approach to the Teaching and learning of Reading and Writing to a 'Structured Literacy' approach in Year 1 and 2. Structured Literacy focuses on 'phonemic awareness (hear, identify, move or change sounds) and alphabet knowledge' - alongside other key components - giving children the skills they need to read, spell and write with confidence. Even though we have always included phonics as part of our Literacy programme, Structured Literacy has a greater emphasis on this strategy.

We are inviting you to come along to a Parent Evening run by Adrienne Kinder who will offer some insight into the research around Structured Literacy and the programme we will follow.

#### **ROAD SAFETY**

I received a call from a driver on Friday to say that they had very nearly hit a child on Masterton Road at the end of the school day. He believed that a dad and several children were crossing the road – he had noticed the main group but there was another child that he had not seen. He had no details of the people involved but he did say he had commented to the parent involved that it was not a safe place to cross. They were crossing at the intersection rather than the crossings.

It may take a little longer to cross at the Pedestrian Crossings, yet it is the safest. Please set a positive example to all our students by using the safe places to cross the roads.

This is a life skill that is hugely important, and the devastating drowning toll that we have had in New Zealand over this summer is a sobering reminder of how important it is to learn water safety skills.



As part of our Physical Education Programme, your child(ren) will have bi-weekly access to the school pool where **they will be supported in becoming safe and confident in and near the water**. It is extremely important that they bring their swimming togs and towels on all of their swimming days to make the most of this amazing resource we have in our school grounds as this is an important part of our curriculum.
